The Ten Principles of Induction

Principle One – Purpose:

The purpose of the induction is to encourage and inspire each candidate to develop firm individual dedication to the ideals of brotherhood and cheerful service.

Principle Two – Eligibility:

The right to earn Ordeal membership is given only by the Scouts of a candidate's home unit during an authorized Order of the Arrow unit election. Only the candidate can overrule their decision.

Principle Three – Candidate's Compliance:

The candidate has the continuous choice of meeting the tests of the Ordeal to the best of his or her ability or withdrawing.

Principle Four – Members' Compliance:

All members participating in the induction must respect and comply with the tests of the Ordeal, to the extent allowed by their responsibilities.

Principle Five – Discretion:

In cases where strict application of the tests and requirements of the induction is not possible, the lodge may choose and alternative that will best preserve the spirit of the induction and the quality of the candidate's experience.

Principle Six – Importance of the Individual:

All actions and procedures must recognize the worth, dignity, and separate identity of the individual and present or potential ability to self-govern.

Principle Seven – Generosity:

The attitude of members toward the candidate must be one of acceptance, respect, understanding, sincerity, friendly encouragement, support, and trust.

Principle Eight – Focus:

Everything in the lodge-created environment must direct the candidate to the central meaning of the induction, without distraction.

Principle Nine – Symbolic Progression:

No symbol or symbolic procedure should be mentioned or used unless and until it is called for in the authorized ceremonies.

Principle Ten – Active Membership:

Lodge policy must recognize that if a member understands the Obligation of the Order and is striving to fulfill it, his dedication in itself accomplishes the major service of the lodge.

Expectations For General Order of the Arrow members

- Respect the tests of our Ordeal Candidates.
 <u>Hazing is not accepted</u> and any occurrence will result in the expulsion of those involved.

 Respect the Candidate's vow of silence by not speaking in their presence (exceptions made when speech is required for the Ordeal or instructions during cheerful service)
- Respect the Ordeal Candidates. A member of the Order of the Arrow should never refer to a Candidate as an "ordealie" or other derogatory term.
- Support our ceremony teams by attending a Pre-Ordeal performance on Friday and Ordeal or Brotherhood performance on Saturday evening.
- Take part in cheerful service on Saturday.
- It is unacceptable to enjoy soft drinks or candy within sight of any Ordeal Candidates. If cheerful service is being performed within close proximity to the Trading Post, it will be closed until Candidates are out of sight. Litter found at Camp Helendade will close the Trading Post for the duration of the weekend.
- Brotherhood members should actively seek out Brotherhood Candidates so they can assist them in their quest to seal their ties of Brotherhood.
- Parents often take the privilege of seeing their son's Ordeal ceremony on Saturday evening.
 When a parent arrives, they will need information. Each general member should welcome these parents and do their best to direct them to the Trading Post for information on ceremony locations and times.
