## Lodge Ordeals



# A Brotherhood Flashback as told by Larry Krikorian

Today is Sunday 16 June 2013--Father's Day! So the girls--my wife, Melissa, and two daughters, Emma-Claire and Evelyn--say I can do anything I want. First thing I want to do this Father's Day morning is tell all my Brothers and Sisters in Cahuilla Lodge 127, about my Brotherhood Weekend. Robert Pitchford's and my Brotherhood Ceremony was exactly 40 years ago today: 16 June 1973. Here is how it went: we took a vow of silence. We slept on the ground somewhere up behind Bear Trap Bowl--not sure where because it was pitch dark. We worked mentally, constantly, on the Obligation, the Admonition and its motions, the Song of our Order. By the way, the Obligation has changed a little bit: Tracy Schultze in 2007 shot me a look like "Gee, you really are old," when I said "which I have now received" after the WWW. We also used to really say our name after "I," not just pause. Back to the Brotherhood story: because Pitchford's dad is an architect--he was a car designer in the 1950s--Rob and I were given the ultimate Brotherhood task: paint the caibos (wooden outhouses). They needed it. The wood was cracking and peeling on some. But as it has been for so many decades, we just needed to refurbish them well enough to get "one more summer of service out of them." Yeah, right. This gives new meaning to "mindful of our traditions," doesn't it? Pitchford and I were given everything we needed: brushes, thinner, various donated--meaning "cast off"--cans of paint. Some paint was colors like '50s school-room yellow; some of it was pretty wild stuff that evidently did not sell. And we were given NO INSTRUCTIONS. Our guide pointed at the equipment, pointed at the caibos, and made a brush-stroke motions with his whole Plains-Indian-leather-fringed arm. I didn't smart off and ask him, "Hey, what's a Plains Indian doin' in Idyllwild?" I just shut up. We went to work. We found the weirdest colors: bright white, fire-engine red, metalized silver, metallic purple, gloss black. I painted a (duh) red-and-white target behind a urinal; Rob and I coated the exterior of an entire unit with metalized silver until it looked like the U.S. Lunar Excursion Module; then, Rob painted a metallic purple outhouse moon over the door. With the glossy black we circled a seat level hole in the back of one caibo, and drew a cartoon balloon attached to the hole which read "No Peeking" or "Don't Look," I forget which. They came to get us in the early afternoon, and we almost flunked Brotherhood. Mike Cheeley or Terry Tyson or Jon Nelson--one of our Chiefs of those days, dressed down the guys that told Rob and me to paint the caibos: "Yeah, you told them to paint 'em alright, but nothin' about how to paint 'em. They did what you told 'em to do." We passed! And the rest is . . . history!

Aloha everyone, this is your friendly Cahuilla lodge chief writing you all from the beautiful green shores of Emerson's lake.


