The National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) is the premier event of the Order of the Arrow. It is Scouting's second-largest national program event. Over 10,000 Arrowmen from across our nation gather for an inspirational and unforgettable experience full of fellowship, training, adventure, and lots of fun!

The 2015 National Order of the Arrow Conference will be held August 2-8, 2015 at Michigan State University in East Lansing, Michigan. The 2015 National Order of the Arrow Conference will celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the Order of the Arrow!

The Lodge will be traveling as a contingent to this event. To start the registration process and to reduce the cost burden to participants, the lodge is starting registration for this event. A \$100 minimum deposit is required to secure your spot.

It is estimated that the cost of this event will range between \$1250 and \$1500, though may change with travel cost and discounts. The registration fee will cover event registration, patches, lodging, meals and travel. Additional cost of uniforms, additional patches, equipment and accessories are the responsibility of each registrant.
