# Support our Troops

Cahuilla Lodge supports our troops through the sale of special lodge flaps. All proceeds from the sale of these flaps are donated to a group that specifically supports our troops and their families, selected by the Arrowmen. We recently completed a campaign selling Marine themed lodge flaps. Mr. Hedrick and Arrowman Sean O'Connor presented the Wounded Warrior Team with a check for the Semper Fi Fund along with a certificate and flap.

SUPPORT OUR TROOPS FLAPS from Cahuilla Lodge are ready for Pre-Order ONLY sign ups. The last day to sign up is July 30th so the flaps can be ordered and distributed at the September LEC.

We are presently doing a Special Numbered Flap for the NAVY with funds going to support their Troops around the World. The idea is we sell the flaps for \$10 with all the profit going to one of the Navy's support groups. This will be approximately \$700 per 100 flaps sold. We are over 200 already pre-ordered.

We will follow the Navy Support our Troops Flap with pre-ordering the Air Force Flap at the September LEC with delivery at the Lodge Banquet January 23, 2016. Later in 2016 we will be doing Flaps for the Coast Guard and Merchant Marines. Support Groups for the other 3 future Flaps will be determined by our LEC at a later date.

#### Centuries of Service

The purpose of the Arrowman Service Award (ASA) is to encourage Arrowmen to recommit themselves to the ideals of the Order, increase their level of service to their local unit and council, and participate in the 100th anniversary celebration of the OA. The award will have three categories of criteria with various requirements that Arrowmen can complete: personal growth, service to Scouting, and participation in the centennial celebration.

The category on personal growth challenges both youth and adult Arrowmen to advance their own leadership skills by participating in or staffing a BSA training course. In tandem with "recommitting themselves to the ideals of the Order," this category also encourages each member to seal the bond of Brotherhood membership (if eligible), among other BSA advancement opportunities.

The category on Scout service advocates for Arrowmen to go above and beyond the traditional call to service and serve in a variety of leadership positions at the unit, council, lodge and national levels. This includes service benefiting the local community, the local BSA council or camp, or public lands such as a national forest or park.

The category on centennial events correlates with the national Order of the Arrow committee's objective to redouble service and programmatic offerings for the 100th anniversary. The youth and adult Arrowmen requirements for this category are the same, and include attendance at their section's 100th anniversary conclave, the lodge's sponsored 100th anniversary event, an ArrowTour event, or the 2015 National Order of the Arrow Conference.



This award, will be recognized as one of the few patches that have ever been approved by the national Order of the Arrow committee to be worn on an OA sash.

As NOAC 2015, approaches and Ordeal season opens, it is time to start ramping up efforts to complete your 2015 Arrowman Service Award requirements by December 2015.
