Why should I go?

The National Order of the Arrow Conference is something of an Arrowman's pilgrimage. **Imagine 8,000 of your fellow Brothers descending on one University for an entire week.** There is more fun stuff to do than one has time for, from national activities and incredible shows, training from the best instructors in the Nation, patch trading upon patch trading, ceremonies evaluation and national competitions, and finally a sense of fellowship and brotherhood unlike any other Order of the Arrow event you will ever attend.

What are the details of the Lodge contingent trip?

Cahuilla Lodge is sponsoring a contingent that will include your registration fee, airline travel from Southern California to Indianapolis, transportation to the University and 1 day of early housing in Bloomington. Our contingent will leave July 31, 2009 and arrive back in Southern California on August 6 or 7, 2009.

How much does N.O.A.C. cost?

The final fee is not established. The fee for the event has not been set just yet and we cannot book our flights until January 2009. However, we expect the price will be approximately \$850.00 to \$950.00 if you attend with the Lodge contingent. If you travel privately to N.O.A.C., your cost will be the conference fee and person travel. **Your conference and airline deposit will be due approximately December 15, 2008 so as many people can apply as possible.**

Why does my deposit not guarantee I can go?

Most likely, we will have no problem accommodating your attendance. Just know that Cahuilla Lodge will be required to have 2 youth attend for every 1 adult. If we don't have enough youth attending, we will have to select adults to go. The best thing to do if you are over 21 is recruit 2 youth to attend N.O.A.C.

Also, Cahuilla Lodge will be given a quota based on our Lodge membership. We will have to apply for additional attendee spots. Normally, this happens in the Spring when other Lodges do not fill their quotas.
